“COMPETITION IN THE CSME AND COMPLIANCE CONSIDERATIONS FOR ATTORNEYS-AT-LAW” Kingston, Jamaica

Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the CARICOM Competition Commission (Commission) remains committed to ensuring the continued building of a competition culture in the CARICOM Single Market and Economy, as set out in its *Strategic Plan 2020 – 2022: A Road Map for Future Growth and Development*.

With this in mind, the Commission is pursuing a number of virtual interventions to ensure that sensitization and training continues to strengthen relationships with the regional business and legal communities who are critical stakeholders.

The Commission's first intervention will be at the 2021 Annual Conference of the Jamaica Bar Association (JAMBAR), via a focused virtual webinar geared towards Attorneys-at-Law on **“Competition in the CSME and Compliance Considerations for Attorneys-at-Law”** on October 28, 2021 by way of Zoom.

With speakers from the Commission, the Barbados Fair Trade Commission and the United States Department of Justice, this webinar aims to sensitize in-house and private counsel on the fundamentals of CARICOM Competition Policy and key considerations for in-house counsel to ensure effective compliance by their organizations.

The Commission's upcoming events for 2021 will also see partnership and outreach to the business and legal communities of Trinidad and Tobago and Guyana with webinars planned for November 2021, and the launch of new modules for our online competition training course.
